In 2019, the TDS Board of Directors convened a strategic planning session shortly after celebrating the 10 year anniversary to discuss the direction the organization would take over the next decade. - More students graduate with a self-identified career path and demonstrate career readiness
- Students are sick less often
- More girls complete secondary school

Teachers

- Teachers demonstrate teaching practices that improve learning outcomes
- Teachers demonstrate self-efficacy

Families

- Families are healthier
- Families support learning outside of the classroom
- Families support careers for girls

Schools

- Schools support parents' engagement in their children's learning
- Schools in the Mara region are able to recruit and retain highly qualified teachers
- Schools are adequately supplied with books and other learning materials

Communities

- Communities embrace educational innovations to improve learning outcomes
- Communities financially support educational activities

Government

- Government allows educational innovations to improve learning outcomes
- Government financially supports educational activities
